NSW Waratahs head to Bowral for Super Rugby trial

The NSW Waratahs have confirmed their opening Super Rugby trial match for 2021 will be in the Southern Highlands, as they take on the Brumbies in Bowral.

It will be the first time the Waratahs have played a fixture of any kind in Bowral, with the match scheduled for Saturday 30 January at 5pm.

It will be the first official hit-out for Rob Penney's side, ahead of their season opener against the Reds on Friday 19 February.
